WHAT QUALIFICATIONS WILL I GET?

Early Years Practitioner – Level 2 Diploma

This course introduces you to caring and supporting development for children and young people. Learn how children develop physically and emotionally, as well as how they learn to interact with others. Understand how to work with children aged 0-5 years and prepare for employment.

TYPE OF ASSESSMENT:

Coursework, practical work placements (minimum 250 hours work experience), and placement observations.
