- An inclusive learning environment with equality and belonging for all.
- Communication with your parents/carers on issues affecting your progress (if under 18).
- Caring, respectful and supportive staff that believe in you and will challenge you to meet your potential.

Teachers and Assessors are committed to providing:

- High quality teaching and learning targeted at your individual learning needs.
- Support and challenge to maximise your opportunities for success during the planned progress reviews.
- Knowledge, Skills and Behaviour development that are directly applicable to your Apprenticeship.
- A stimulating, safe, and well managed learning environment.
- Independent learning appropriate to your chosen
 Apprenticeship Standard, with assessment and feedback that supports you to improve.
- Mutually agreed targets with all stakeholders including apprentice, assessor and employer that mean you understand what you need to do next.
- Preparation and support for End Point Assessment.
- Assistance with logging Off the Job hours. It's an apprentice's responsibility to complete, but we will guide you.

Your commitment to your learning looks like:

- Bring the best version of yourself to your Apprenticeship and take responsibility for your own learning.
- Being fully engaged with all aspects of your Apprenticeship including the work and college elements as well as pastoral topics including careers guidance, reviews, safeguarding, equality, diversity and British values awareness training.
- WEARING YOUR LANYARD AND BADGE around your neck at all times to indicate you are a valued part of our College and you proudly represent the apprentice cohorts within the group.
- Being organised and prepared for all lessons and workshop sessions, wearing PPE as required <u>ALWAYS</u>.
- Maintaining excellent attendance. Minimum expectation is 95% in all areas of your Apprenticeship.
- Making sure that work you submit for assessment is your own.
- Avoiding taking holidays or making external appointments during your timetabled week.
