- Communication with your parents/carers on issues affecting your progress (if under 18).

Teachers are committed to providing:

- High quality teaching and learning targeted at your individual learning needs.
- Support and challenge to maximise your progress.
- Skills, knowledge and behaviour development that are directly applicable to the workplace.
- A stimulating, safe, and well managed learning environment.
- Independent learning appropriate to the course, with assessment and feedback that supports you to improve.
- Mutually agreed targets that mean you understand what you need to do next.

Your commitment to your learning looks like:

- Working hard to the best of your ability and take responsibility for your own learning.
- Being fully engaged with all aspects of your programme of study including careers guidance, tutorial, work experience, and Maths and English where applicable.
